INCIDENT STATISTICS:

- Total Incidents, Last 24 Hours: 441
 Daily Staffing Level: Full Staffing
- COVID-19 DICO Responses, Last 24 Hours: 9



A mask use directive will be issued today in an Office of the Chief for mask use on non-emergency and routine activities.

- Specifications:
 - o Made from three layers of antibacterial cloth components: polyester, triclosan (antibacterial and antifungal agent)
 - UV protection 30+
 - o Protects against dust, polluted air, and ultraviolet rays
 - o Prevents dust and toxic gases such as So2, H2S, motor car/engine exhaust
 - o Protects against pollution smells: exhaust, cigarette smoke
- Directions for Use:
 - o Press metal nose clip for a secure fit against face
 - o Per CDC: Cloth facemasks are not surgical masks or N95 respirators
 - o Be careful NOT to touch eyes, nose, and mouth when removing mask
 - Wash hands after removing
- Directions for Care:
 - o Wash by hand or on gentle cycle regularly
 - o Do not tumble dry high
 - When not in use store in a clean area/surface

Per the <u>CDC</u>, recent studies indicate that a significant portion of individuals with coronavirus lack symptoms ("asymptomatic") and that even those who eventually develop symptoms ("pre-symptomatic") can transmit the virus to others before showing symptoms.

Updated Document: <u>COVID-19 Response and Decon Protocol</u>

- The updated document is replacing "COVID-19 Response and PPE Guidelines" with the intent of:
 - Transitioning from guidelines to a protocol
 - o Providing direction when PPE inventory is low
 - Providing patient assessment parameters to use when determining if high-risk procedures are needed
 - o Moving mask testing/reuse to a standalone document

N-95 Use Limitations:

- Should be discarded when it becomes:
 - o Damaged or deformed
 - o No longer forms an effective seal to the face
 - o Becomes wet or visibly dirty
 - Breathing becomes difficult
 - o Contaminated with blood, respiratory or basal secretions or other bodily fluids from patients
